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Suggested Duffel (clothing) List for a Typical Six Day/5 Night Canoe Trip

Jasper Company provides two campers one #3 Duluth Pack (21"x22"x6") to pack their personal gear. Remember if you bring extra, you will carry the extra as well.

In addition to what you are wearing on the departure day, consider packing the following:

2 pairs under clothes	1 long sleeve shirt	1 warm sweater or jacket
2 pairs heavy socks	1 short sleeve shirt	2 hats with visor
2 pairs light socks	1 pair pants	1 swimsuit
1 sleep apparel	personal/toiletry items	1 towel & washcloth

Rain Gear

Quality rain jacket with hood & rain pants

Quality rain gear is of the utmost importance. Avoid lightweight ponchos & bargain raincoats. Select raingear that can withstand a heavy down pour and keep you warm.

Footwear

Your feet will get wet on a canoe trip!

You will **NEED** two pairs of shoes

One that will get wet during the day

One that will stay dry for camp

It is best if your shoes are well broken in.

Hiking boots & tennis shoes are both good

Aqua socks /sandals are a must for swimming

"If you do not want your hiking boots or tennis shoes to get wet – bring knee high rubber boots, but remember these boots get hot when worn all day."

Spring & Fall Trips

Long johns - Insulated knee high boots

Wool socks - 2 pairs gloves-stocking cap

What Campers Shouldn't Forget

Insect repellent

Sun screen (30 spf or higher)

Toothbrush & toothpaste

Dental Floss

Camera

Flashlight

Sunglasses (2 pairs)

A form of identification

Personal medications

Aspirin/pain reliever

Notepad & pen

Extra camera batteries

Extra flashlight batteries

FINAL THOUGHT: Bring what you think you need to be comfortable but don't bring too much. Keep track of what you use and do not use. You will pack lighter on your next trip.
